Location: Moondogs Too (Upstairs)



Sinclair Inlet Yacht Club – History

It has been some time since the history of **SINCLAIR INLET YACHT CLUB** has been published, we thought a little refresher would be in order. To give our newer members a sense of the club they have joined. And to say a thank you to the original members who are still around for their efforts to establish SIYC.

The first organizational meeting was held on September 25, 1974. Three meetings followed during which a name was chosen, the bylaws were written and officers were elected. Those who attended the three meetings were considered to be Charter Members. It was decided that the boat was to be considered the active voting members; there was to be no auxiliary.

The **SIYC** Burgee colors and design were selected for their association with the area. The Seahorse: The City of Port Orchard was using the Seahorse as the mascot for their annual Fourth of July celebration.

The Trident: Symbolizes the building of the Trident Submarine being built at that time. Sinclair Inlet Yacht Club was chartered as a non-profit organization in March 1975.
